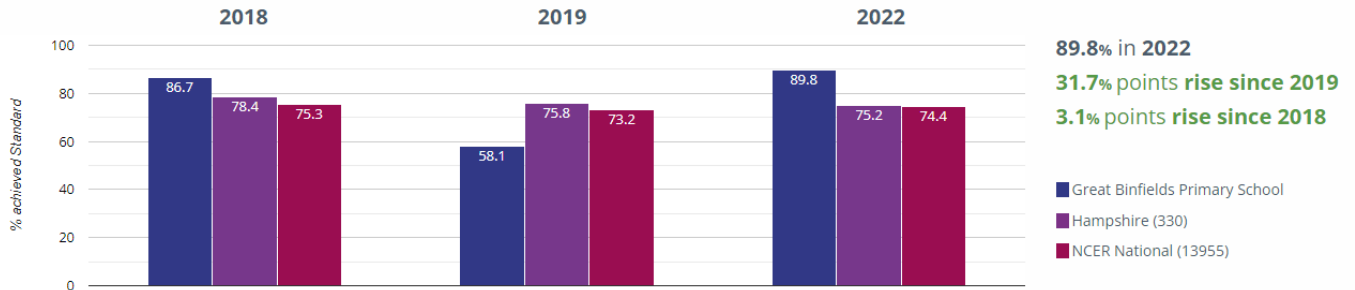




Great Binfields Primary School Year 6 End of KS2 Sat Results 2022

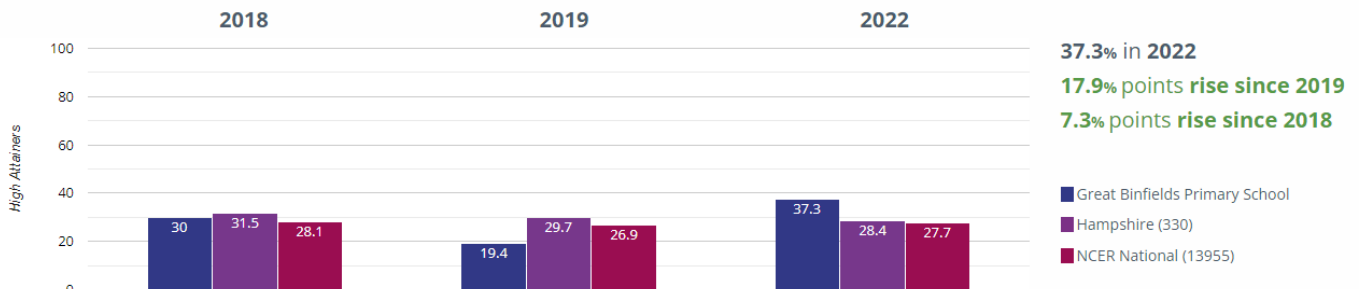
KS2 Reading:

Reading - achieved standard



In 2022, 89.8 % of our GBP Year 6 children (53/59) achieved the expected standard (EXS) in reading which is significantly above the National average of 74.4% and Hampshire's average of 75.2%. Reading has been as school improvement area for our whole school and we are delighted that standards are back in line with our previous standards pre 2019.

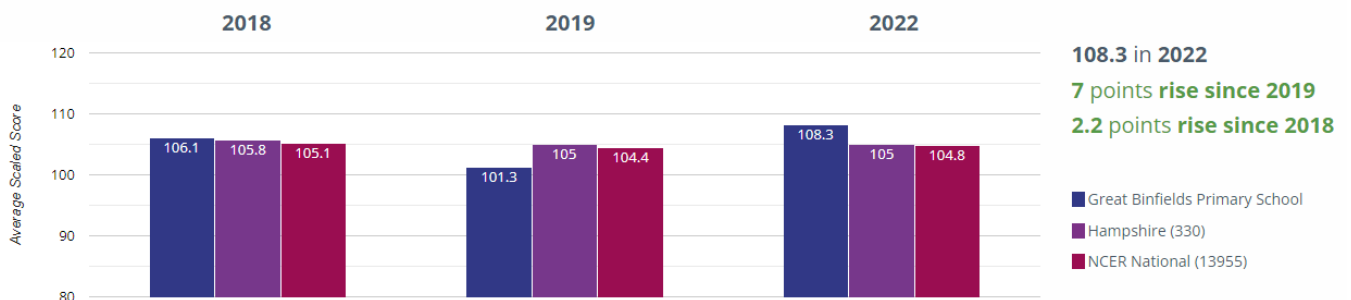
Reading - high attainers



37.3% of our Year 6 children (26/59) achieved Greater Depth Standard (GDS) in reading which is 8.9% above Hampshire average (28.4%) and 9.6% above the National average (27.7%).

In comparing 2019 figures, we have seen a 17.9% significant increase on the number of children achieving the Greater Depth Standard (GDS) in Reading, a target from our last Ofsted inspection

Reading - average scaled score



Each child's raw score in the test (32/50 in the Reading test, for example) is turned into a scaled score, based on making comparisons with the other children across the country who took the same test. The scaled scores are centred around 100. That means that:

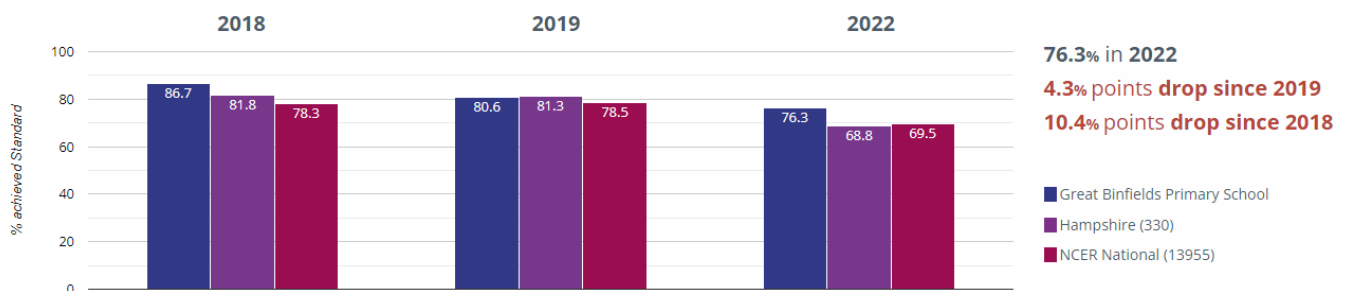
- A score of 100 means the child is working 'at the expected standard' for a Year 6 child. 80 is the lowest possible score and 120 is the highest.
- A scaled score of 99 or less means they haven't reached the government's 'expected standard'.

In 2022, GBP scaled score is 108.3 compared with the National average scaled score was 104.8 in Reading, with the Hampshire average scaled score being 105. GBP above both Hampshire and National in 2022 and the best results the school has achieved in the past 5 years.

Our school improvement planning focus for 2022/2023 will be to maintain % ARE, GDS scores and APS in-line with Hampshire and above National averages once again.

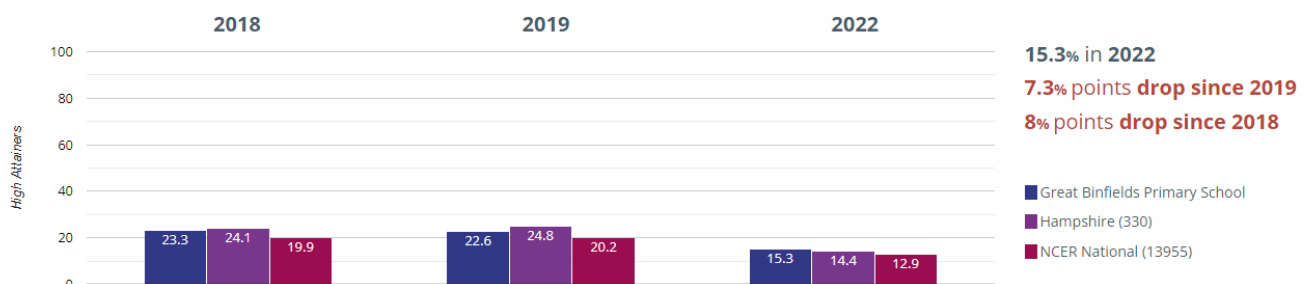
KS2 Writing:

✍ Writing - achieved standard



In 2022, 76.3% of our Year 6 children (46/60) achieved the expected standard in Writing which is well above the National average of 69.5% and Hampshire's average of 68.8%. This is particularly pleasing as writing (alongside reading) has been a county wide priority for improvement since the pandemic.

✍ Writing - high attainers

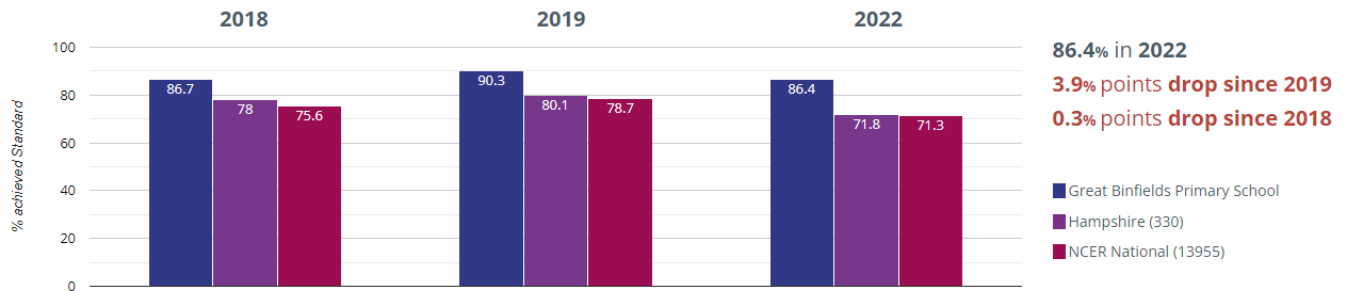


In 2022, 15.3% of our Year 6 children (9/60) achieved the Greater Depth Standard (GDS) in Writing which compares favourably to the National average of 12.9% and Hampshire's average of 14.4%. Overall, our school's GDS figures have been steady since 2018. Steadily in line with Hampshire statistics and above National since 2018

Our school improvement planning focus for 2022/2023 will be to maintain % ARE Writing standards in line with both Hampshire and National GDS averages however we wish to reach previous ARE and GDS standards of 2018 and 2019..

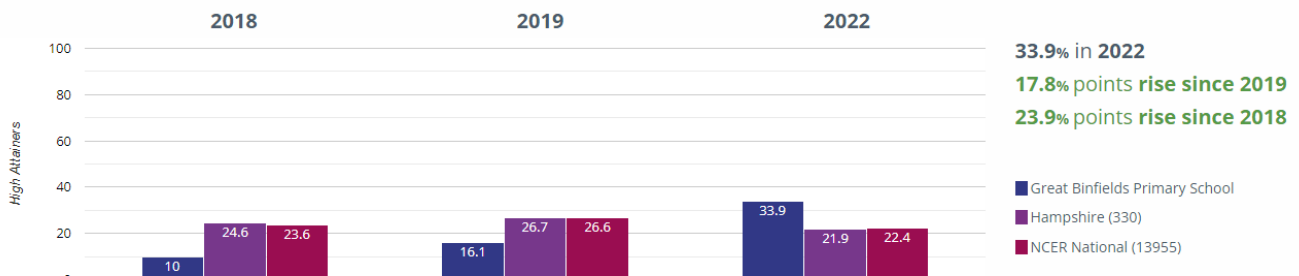
KS2 Maths:

+ Maths - achieved standard



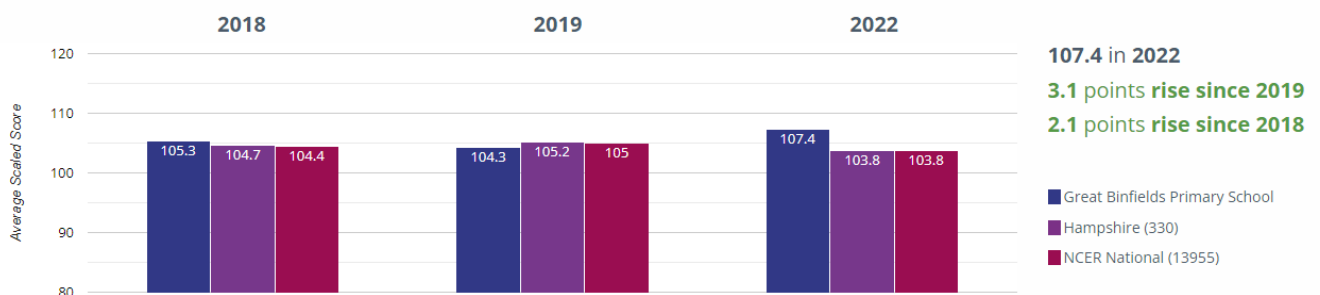
In 2022, 86.4% of our Year 6 children (51/59) achieved the expected standard in Maths. This attainment is also significantly above the National average (71.3%) by 15.1% and Hampshire's average (71.8%) by 14.6%. This has been the case for the last 3 years of Maths SATs.

+ Maths - high attainers



In 2022, 33.9% of our GBP Year 6 (20/59 children achieved Greater Depth Standard (GDS) in Maths. This compares favourably to the Hampshire's and National standards. GBP GDS averages are well above National and Hampshire averages. We are delighted with this as this was an Ofsted school improvement target for us.

+ Maths - average scaled score

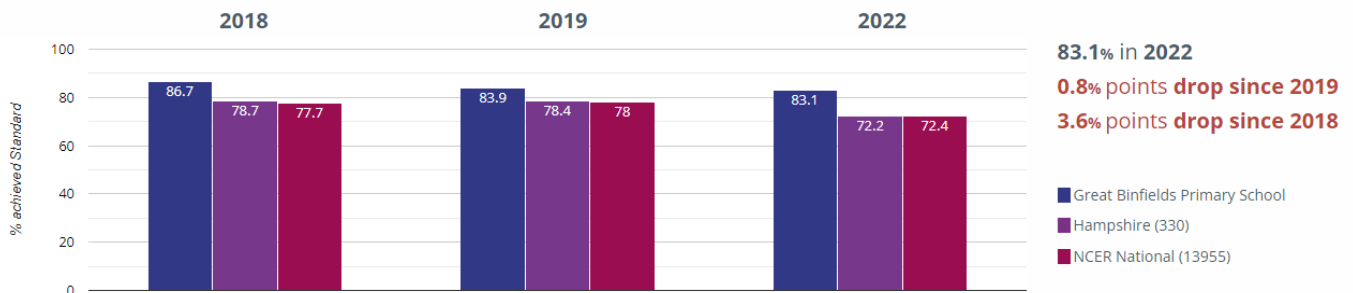


In 2022, the National average scaled score was 103.8 in Maths which is in line with Hampshire averages. In 2022, GBP is 107.4 significantly above both National and Hampshire scaled scores averages. Our school's highest score for 5 years.

Our school improvement planning focus for 2022/2023 will be to maintain our standards % ARE and GDS in Maths

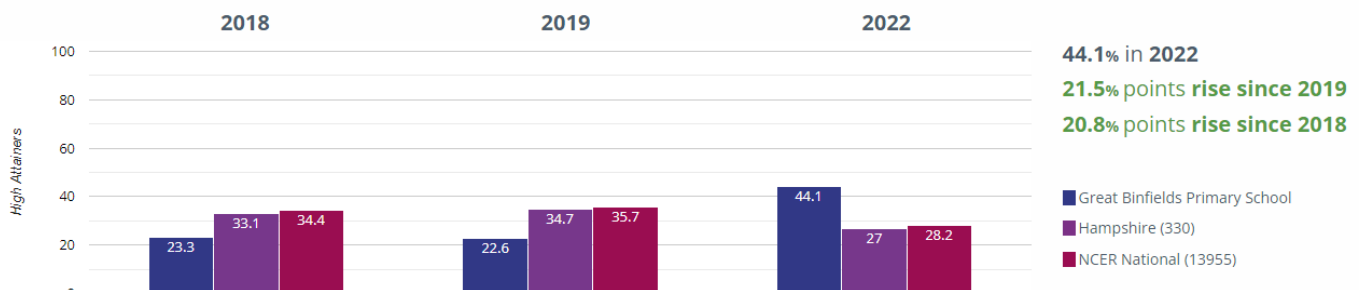
KS2 GPS – Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling:

GPS - achieved standard



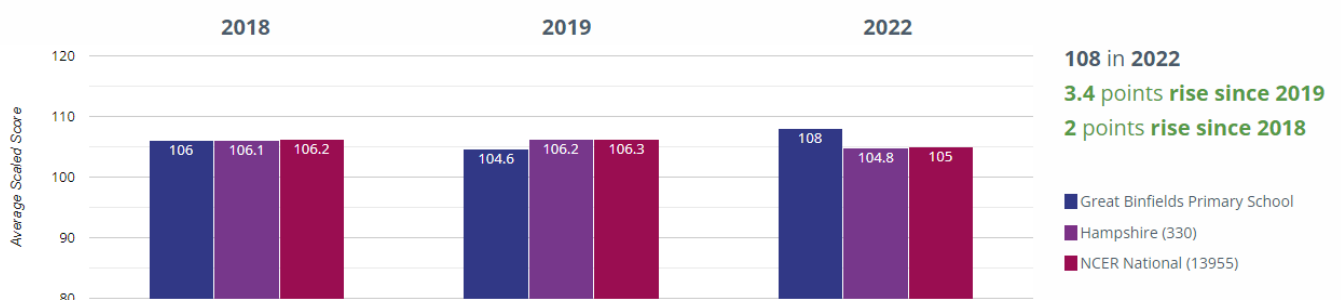
In 2022, 83.1% of our GBP Year 6 children (49/59) achieved the Expected Standard (EXS) in GPS which is once again favourably above both National (72.4%) by 10.7% and Hampshire's averages (72.2%) by 10.9%. This has been the case for the last 5 years.

GPS - high attainers



In 2022, 44.2% of our GBP Year 6 children (26/59) achieved the Greater Depth Standard (GDS) in GPS which is significantly above National (28.2%) and Hampshire's averages (27%). We are delighted as this was an Ofsted target area.

GPS - average scaled score

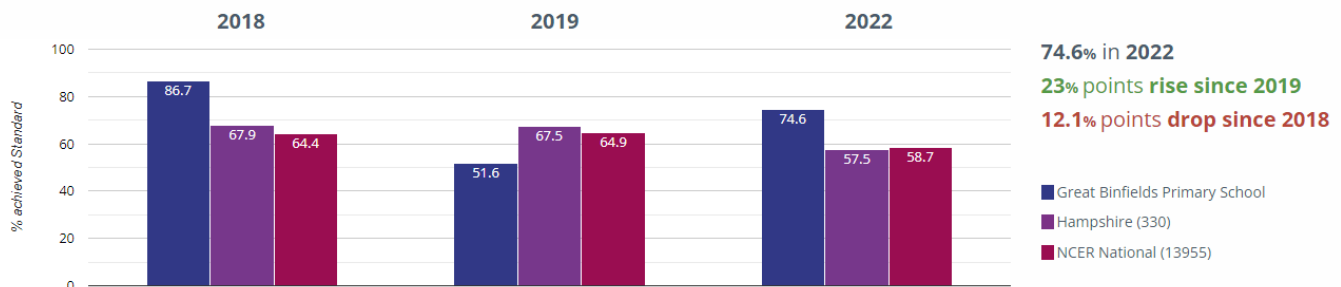


In 2022, the GPS GBP's scaled score was 108, a 1.4, significantly above National average scaled score of 105 and 104.8 for Hampshire. Our best score in the 5 years.

Our school improvement planning focus for 2022/2023 will be to maintain our standards % ARE and GDS SPAG so they continue to be in line with or above both national and Hampshire scores.

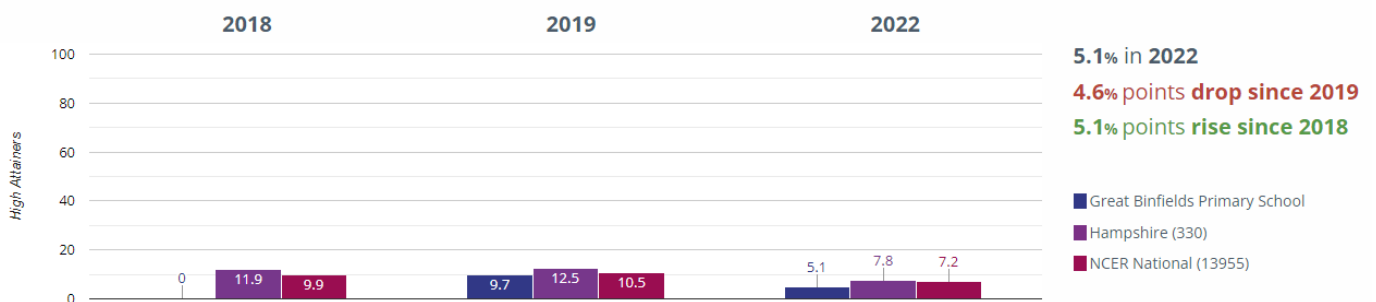
KS2 Combined results (Reading, Writing and Maths)

RWM - achieved standard



2022 - At GBP, 74.6% of the current (Year 6 2022) cohort reached the Expected Standard (EXS) in Reading, Writing and Mathematics which is significantly above the National average of 58.7% and the Hampshire average of 57.5%. We are delighted to jump back above Hampshire and National Averages again.

RWM - high attainers



2022 – 5.1% of the Year 6 children in the 2022 cohort reached the greater depth standard in all areas of reading, writing and maths. This level of GDS attainment is below what pupils achieve Nationally (7.2%) and that of Hampshire’s average of 7.8%.

Our school improvement planning focus for 2022/2023 will be to achieve % combined GDS scores in-line with Hampshire averages.
